A Race to Heaven

Just last week we witnessed what some might call a billionaire's space race as our Caribbean neighbour, Richard Branson, was the first to launch a space flight that ascended some 52 miles only to be bested days later by Amazon's Jeff Bezos, who elevated to 62 miles.

This reminds me of our own space race against the Soviets that was triggered by Sputnik back in 1957 when I was just one-year-old. I remember it well. (Not really). But I do remember the space race that it engendered and that famous, Bob Dylan song lyric which sardonically asked, "I don't know but I've been told the streets of heaven are lined with gold; I ask you how things could get much worse if the Russians happen to get up there first?"

Indeed, the space race was as much about propaganda as it was about science. In fact, according to a meditation from The Daily Bread, when the first Russian astronaut, Yuri Gagarin, came back down to earth in a dual parachute with his orange suit and space helmet intact, a simple farm woman asked him, "Can it be that you have come from outer space?"

His straightforward answer: "As a matter of fact, I have."

Of course, the Soviets turned Yuri into both a communist icon and an anti-Christian propaganda tool by stating, "Gagarin went into space, but he didn't see any god there," (Apparently, Gagarin never really said that, but the communists were never much concerned with truth.) But, as "C. S. Lewis observed, 'Those who do not find [God] on earth are unlikely to find Him in space.'"

And this is certainly true since we know that the "heavens declare his glory" 24/7, 365 days (and nights) of the year as we are surrounded by overwhelming evidence of God's creative and intelligent design, thus, we are without excuse if we deny God's existence for we must actively and wilfully repress the evidence that is all around us to do so.

So, I'm not sure if either Richard Branson or Jeff Bezos got a better view of God during their brief sojourn in space, but we certainly do from every vantage point here on earth, including the beautiful beaches of Puerto Rico and her amazing sunsets. Thus, let us rejoice that God is the kind of creator who makes himself clearly known not only by the created world around us, but even more so through the Word that became flesh and dwelt among us.

Christian Ed Chair Wanda Montalvo


• What brought you to Puerto Rico and 2UC?

A New Ministry In The Midst of a Pandemic

This month, we are highlighting a special ministry that was initiated by Loida and Steve during the pandemic to provide support and love to their local community in Virginia. We hope their example will encourage you to do likewise!

Generous and Giving LB Neighbors Support Needy Culmore Families

With the ongoing and very special support of numerous Lake Barcroft (LB) neighbors, collectively we have continued an informal donations and giving programs as the Culmore Families Support Project. A recently example with photos, of special human interest, is being summarized here. In addition a summary of the past three months is offered. These informal activities by many caring LB residents are in support of very needy Culmore area families; several are long term residents whose children born here are U.S. citizens. Others are recent arrivals but equally deserving of generous assistance for basic living; they arrive with nearly nothing!

Recently an LB resident and her daughter donated over one hundred Barbie dolls and large size Barbie accessories from their splendid collection! The dolls and accessories were laid out in grand style outside the Woodrow Wilson Library, for mothers and young children to select therefrom. Why there? Twice per week there is a free food truck distributing provisions to needy Culmore area mothers and families. The setting is typically in the library's parking lot. Many mothers and mostly young daughters, also sons, line up for hours and early to receive their share of food provisions.

On this occasion in July, they received not only food provisions: the excited young children also got to choose one or more Barbie dolls, clothing changes, Barbie toys and accessories. Some boys got to receive a "Ken doll" as a Barbie

boyfriend. The attached photos show smiling and excited young Barbie recipients with their new gifts - LB donated barbie dolls! Many thanks and a "shout-out" of special appreciation to Lake neighbors (all of whom have requested anonymity) who share with very needy local families.

In the past three months a host of family donations and living items have been provided; and set up on Culmore area apartments. This has included nine beds, several new with mattresses, three car seats, two baby strollers, two air conditions, four microwaves, kitchenware, sheets and pillows for the bedding, a sleep sofa and a day bed, dinning tables and chairs, and two chest of drawers. In addition, two of the donated sleep items were bunk beds with a trundle that sleep two to three each. This is super useful in the heavily occupied, space limited Culmore apartments.

Other Lake Residents donated money to purchase needed items, and others provided both truck or van transportation, and human labor, to move the large items from LB to Culmore. Often the items such as bunk beds required

extensive assembly on site before they could become useful. LB family members, assisted by Culmore residents, performed the needed assembly. One family donated considerable time and labor to help transport and set up the beds. Two of the recipient families live on third floor walkup apts.; carrying the bulky beds, mattresses, chests of drawers up three flights of stairs was a challenge. Others donated extra canned food items which had been stockpiled due to the COVID pandemic, but no longer needed. Multiple cans of tuna, salmon and more purchased during the pandemic were shared with several Culmore families.

This is overall a "win-win" effort in which the residents of Lake Barcroft donate (downsize) the items they no longer have use for, or wish to donate and the needy residents of Culmore apts. can readily repurpose them.





What happens when you combine a volunteer missionary with an English tutor and a group of kids who need to learn to love English . . . a 2UC Summer English Camp.

In March Christie was approached by Kendra Jones, who is a middle-school teacher in central Illinois. She expressed an interest in serving in Puerto Rico as a missionary for a month in the summer. The two put their heads together and the result was an English Camp geared for our Backpack Program students. The church had made a decision not hold VBS, so it seemed like God opened the doors for this amazing opportunity.

As it turns out, the weeks that Kendra was available were the same weeks that Christie was not available. But the Lord is gracious and we are so grateful for Edith, Loraine, Mabel, Ana, Gina, Ramón, Joshua, Ginnie and so many others who volunteered to help out. It was a stressful three weeks, but it was an incredible blessing for the participants.

Our hearts go out in gratitude to Kendra, her son, Eli and other family
